Warren W. Danner died on Tuesday, December 21 after an extended illness. His passing is a great loss to Sandy Springs Lodge. WB Danner was a faithful and knowledgeable member of our Lodge for many years. He began his Masonic Journey in Columbus, Georgia, where he was Master of the Lodge in 1952.

His funeral service was held at the Sandy Springs First Baptist Church, with Dr. Terry Quick officiating. The service was attended by at least 22 Masons, several of whom were from his Lodge in Columbus.

The Masonic graveside service was provided by Past Grand Master Joseph P. Suttles, a long-time associate and personal friend of Warren. They had been active together in Mt. Horeb Council #155 and Euclid Chapter #33, Royal and Select Masters, which meet at the Sandy Springs Lodge.
