### Doyle Davis is 50-year Mason

WB Doyle C. Davis will receive his 50-year apron and pin at the next meeting of Sandy Springs Lodge, to be held on Tuesday, November 23.

Dinner will be served at 6:15 p.m. (note the change in time), after which two awards will be



presented. The first is to Brother James M. Bruce, a 70-year Mason, who is now a resident at Merrill Gardens in Sandy Springs. Mr. Bruce has sons and a daughter in the Atlanta area and some of them are expected to attend along with him. Although the Grand Lodge of Georgia does not give a 70-year pin, one is given by the Grand Lodge of South Carolina, where he has his membership.

Doyle Davis is a past master of Sandy Springs Lodge, but he was raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason on October 6, 1954 in Westwood Lodge #353 in Little Rock, Arkansas. He rose to the station of Junior Warden before before being transferred out of state.

Eventually he came to Atlanta where WB Ken McIntosh invited him to visit Sandy Springs Lodge, affiliating with our Lodge in 1987. He became master of the Lodge in 1995 after spending five years progressing through the chairs. He is an active member of the York Rite bodies, having served as High

Priest and Illustrious Master. He also is a member of the Scottish Rite and Shrine organizations in the Atlanta area.

WB Davis is married and he and his wife Louise reside on Old Canton Road in Marietta. They have two sons, one daughter and six grandchildren.
